Purpose:

- 1. To take stock of UN and Member States' current guidance, policy, reports, capacity-building, pre-deployment preparations and exercises, and evaluations tools, for mission leadership in UN peace operations. Best practice in leadership preparation and training from the private sector will act as a control reference [Results of workshop (including preparatory and follow-up work) to be presented at the Annual Forum 2017 in Istanbul and feed into the Work Strand.]
- 2. To initiate a paper on *The Impact of Leadership on UN Peace Operations* aimed for Member States, Secretariat, Mission Leadership Teams, and Middle Management on what is required to better select, prepare, support and evaluate Senior Leaders, Mission Leadership Teams and Middle Management pre-deployment and inmission. The paper will explore what leadership is required in the unique setting of peace operations, and be published as a Challenges Forum Occasional Paper. [A draft paper to be ready for the Annual Forum in Istanbul, to be finalized after final feed-back and input from Partners].
- 3. To assess, adjust and detail the work plan for the Challenges Forum Work Strand 2017- 2018, confirming desired outcomes, outputs, division of labor, including hosting organizations, resources and deadlines.
