	1. Analysis: Integrating climate risks into analysis and planning
	Peace operations need to understand how climate change is impacting them and their security and peace context. Identifying climate-related security risks and then assessing the scale of their impact lays the foundation for prioritizing actions that need to be taken. It can also help to mainstream these risks into the wider mandates of peace operations to deliver a more conflict-sensitive response.

Peace operations should equally look at both conflict risks and climate change vulnerability, thus addressing and transforming the underlying structures and drivers of insecurity within countries.
