

### Practical Information - Challenges Annual Forum, 14-16 October 2025

1. Venue

The Challenges Annual Forum 2025 (CAF25) will be organised by the Kofi Annan International Peacekeeping Training Centre (KAIPTC) located on <u>Teshie Road</u>. The main venue for the Conference is the **Schroder Hall** at the KAIPTC.

#### 2. Registration

Participants need to register their attendance through the <u>registration</u> (link also in invitation). We will gather all information on the event at the Challenges Forum website. There you will find practical information, the most up-to-date programme and other useful information.

### 3. Accommodation and Transportation

Participants at CAF25 are encouraged to stay at the <u>Labadi Beach Hotel</u>, where we have secured a negotiated rate of USD 200 per night for a standard room. A booking code to access this rate will be shared and will be valid during a specified booking period. Shuttle service will be provided between Labadi Beach Hotel and the conference venue.

As an alternative option, participants may also choose to stay at the <u>ASA Royal</u> <u>Hotel</u>, where the negotiated rate is USD 70 per night. While no shuttle service will be provided from this location, it is conveniently located close to Labadi Beach Hotel.

Participants travelling by air to Accra will arrive at the Kotoka International Airport. Participants will be responsible for arranging their own transportation from the airport to their respective hotels.

### 4. Medical and Fitness

Participants may be required to show relevant certificates/vaccination record for Yellow Fever (yellow booklet) along with their passports on arrival at the Kotoka International Airport.

It is the responsibility of participants to ensure that they carry with them proper health/vaccination documentation. You are advised to secure health insurance before travelling.

There is an infirmary on hand at the KAIPTC which is accessible to KAIPTC participants with routine medical care. More serious needs will be attended to at the 37 Military Hospital. Costs for medical care shall be borne by the participants. All participants taking prescribed medication should arrive with sufficient supplies for the duration of the forum.

Please note that all participants are solely responsible for arranging and securing their own travel insurance and health care. The organizers will not be liable for any costs or losses incurred due to travel disruptions, medical emergencies, or other unforeseen events.

# 5. Visa application

- *Electricity:* In Ghana, there are two associated plug types, D and G. Plug type D is the plug which has three round pins in a triangular pattern and type G is the plug which has three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern. Ghana operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.
